

COLLEGE LEVEL EXAMINATION PROGRAM (CLEP) POLICY

The University of Pittsburgh at Bradford cooperates with the National College Level Examination Program (CLEP). Under this program, students who feel that their knowledge of certain subject is extensive may elect to take CLEP examinations. Scores required for the award of credit from CLEP examinations (as well as Advanced Placement [AP] credit) have been set by the College faculty. Students are eligible for CLEP credit only if CLEP examinations are taken prior to the completion of 30 college credits, including transfer credits. Limitations of credit earned through CLEP examinations are as follows:

- (a) The credit must be useful in a student's program of study.
- (b) Credit will not be granted if a student has completed an equivalent or more advanced course in the discipline.
- (c) Duplicate credit in the same subject is not awarded in any case.
- (d) A student who has earned CLEP credit at other institutions must have their test scores reevaluated to determine eligibility for credit at the University of Pittsburgh at Bradford.
- (e) Credit is granted, but grades and quality points are not assigned or recorded.

Credit Maximum

A combined total of 60 credits may be awarded through CLEP, AP, military courses, and challenge examinations administered by academic department within Pitt-Bradford.

CLEP Examinations

Upon completing an examination, a student will receive credit (as indicated in the chart below) based on the score he or she achieves.
